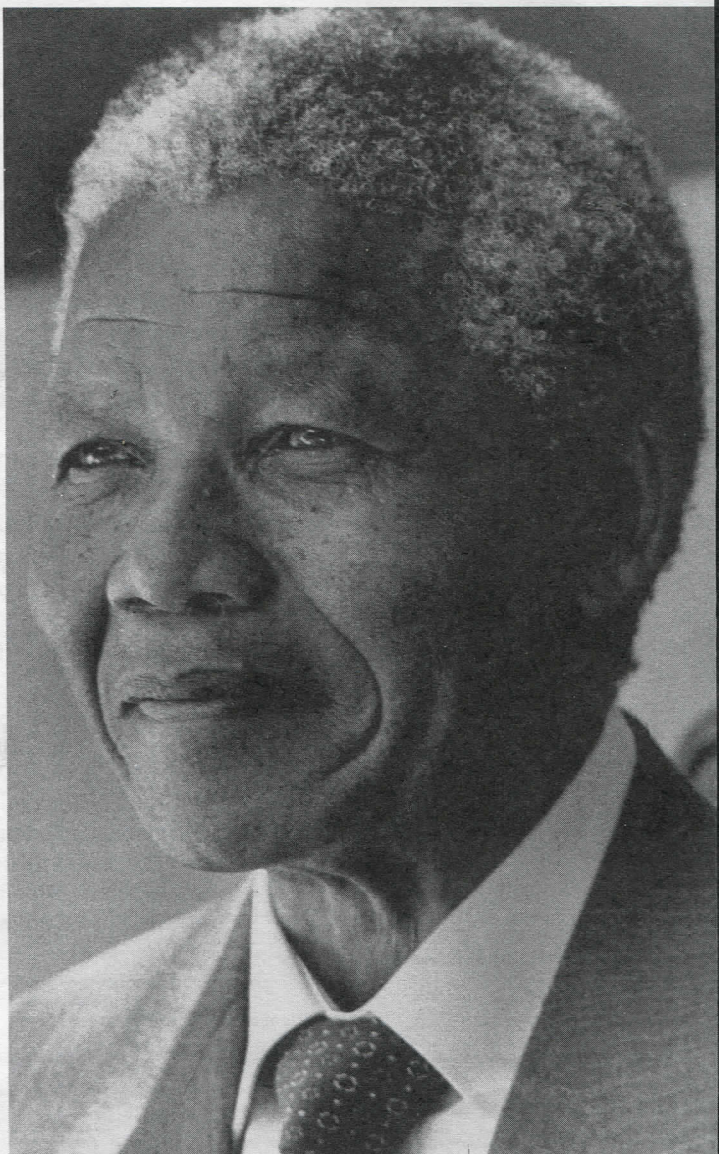

Shell is the market leader in South Africa's strategic oil market and supplies the military and police with oil products.

Shell's involvement in the chemical industry makes it a strategic partner in the apartheid regime's military-industrial complex.

In South Africa, Shell has been named as the 'worst employer' in the oil sector, by shop stewards of the Chemical Workers Industrial Union .

After more than 70 years in South Africa, Shell is still a typical apartheid company - whites hold the key posts, blacks do the dirty and dangerous work.

In Britain the Shell boycott campaign is supported by trade unions, churches, environmental groups and many other organisations.

Aside from Britain, the boycott Shell campaign is running in the USA, Netherlands, and at least a dozen other countries.

Nelson Mandela, since his release from prison, has issued a clear appeal to the world - **maintain sanctions against South Africa.**

Sanctions are beginning to work. De Klerk has been forced to move - by the strength of popular resistance to apartheid inside South Africa. And by international pressures, especially through sanctions and disinvestment.

But apartheid is still a grim reality for the people of South Africa. Only continued pressure for the complete ending of apartheid will compel de Klerk to move further. And there are many obstacles to overcome before South Africa is a free country. United, non-racial, and democratic.

Shell spends millions advertising its claim to be anti-apartheid. But as a major importer and refiner of oil it undermines the UN oil embargo and helps to fuel the apartheid system. And its key role in mining and exporting cheap coal undermines an important area of the sanctions campaign.

That's why the Anti-Apartheid Movement calls for a boycott of Shell.
