OSCAR MPETHA

Oscar Mpetha, National Organiser of the African Food and Canning Workers Union, has been held in solitary confinement in South Africa since August 14 under the Terrorism Act. A founder member of SACTU, he was at the centre of the Fattis and Monis bakery workers' strike in South Africa earlier this year, helped to organise the bus boycott and the Nyanga Residents' Association, and has a long history of anti-apartheid activity in South Africa. Oscar Mpetha is 74 and a diabetic. He may die in prison unless a campaign can be mounted to secure his release.
