THE SOUTH AFRICAN CRICKET ASSOCIATION

This is the South African cricketing authority at present recognised by the M.C.C., and is therefore responsible for the present tour of Great Britain.

It is run on the basis of a colour bar and all who wish to join must be of pure white descent. This means that the Association itself ensures that only white players can represent South Africa at cricket.

There is a multi-racial Association in the Union of South Africa known as the South African Cricket Board of Control, but this is not recognised as the official body by the M.C.C.

Please remember that a part of your admission money will go to the funds of the South African Cricket Association which practises racial discrimination.

An Open Letter to all Sportsmen

Dear Sportsmen,

There is no doubt that the South African Cricket Association by imposing a strict policy of racial segregation is sponsoring Apartheid and thus introducing politics into South African Sport.

We therefore ask you to join us this summer in protesting to the South African Cricket Association at this violation of the code of sport and to the M.C.C., for permitting it to happen here. We believe that sport can bridge the gap of colour and possibly help South Africa to find an answer to her problems, but this will never come about so long as bodies like the South African Cricket Association maintain their present policies.
