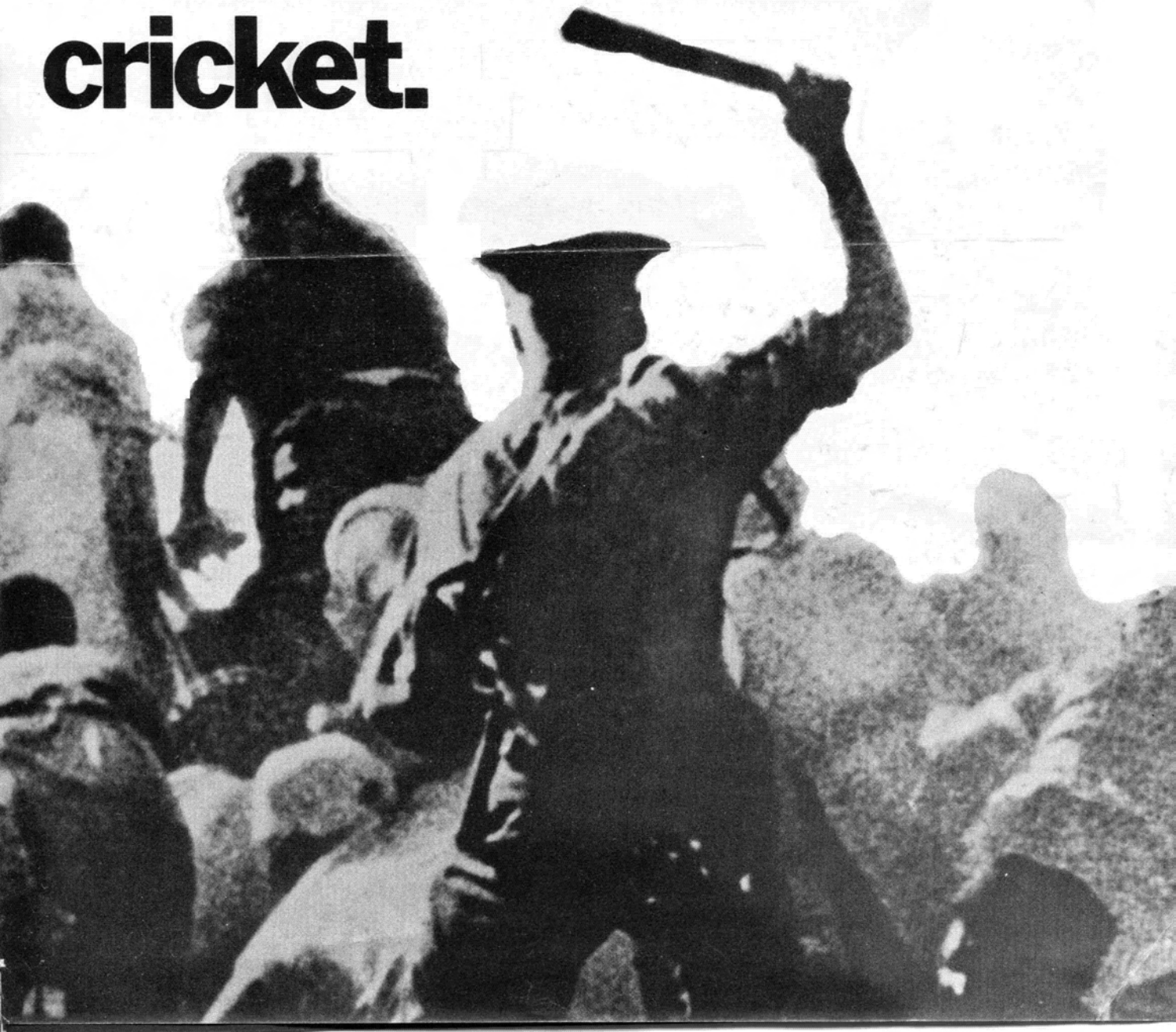


**If you could see

The picture overleaf shows white South Africa keeping black South Africa in its place.

And they have the law on their side. The law of Apartheid.

This same law chose the South African cricket team. Which means that 80% of the population is ineligible for selection because it is black.

(It's not the only thing black South Africans are ineligible for. They cannot vote, strike, earn much above a pittance, or even move around their country without fear of arrest.)

How can we make such a blatantly racist cricket team welcome in this country?

How can we ignore the fact that they are the chosen representatives of probably the most repressive government on earth?

In the Anti-Apartheid Movement, we don't think you can ignore it.

We want you to protest. To make it known that you do not want the white South African cricket team in this country.
