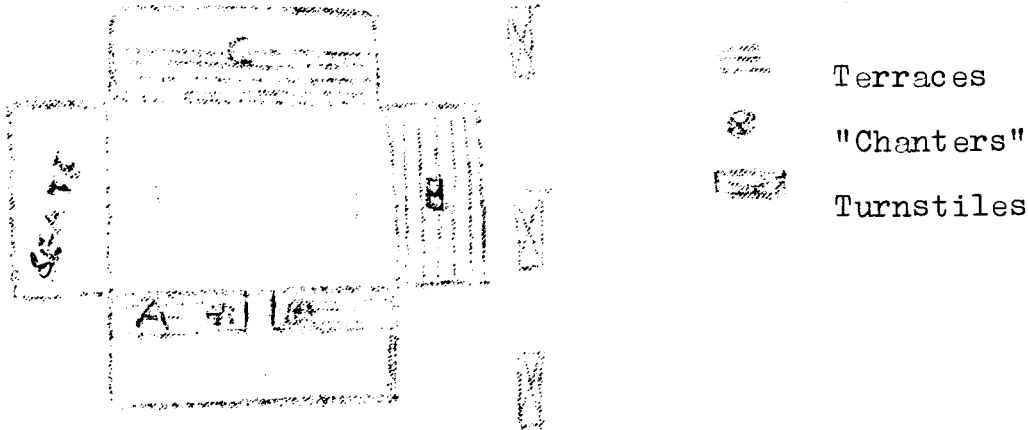


CONFIDENTIAL: BRIEFING ON TWICKENHAM NOVEMBER 22nd



Developments at the 4 matches already played on the rugby tour strongly support STST's view that the only way we are going to stop the tour is by going on the pitch and disrupting matches. Punch-ups outside the ground do not achieve anything positive - non-violent militancy inside does. At Twickenham, our protests will be in two parts:

(a) "CHANTERS", who will form up at the players' tunnel from 1 pm onwards (if circumstances force us to change this venue, then those not wishing to go onto the pitch should make for the noisy section of the demonstration). Make as much noise as possible.

(b) "DISRUPTERS", who will be completely separate from the "Chanters". Come in groups and get down to the front of the terraces up against the fence. Dress respectably. Do not appear to be in groups (i.e. only talk to your neighbour, and preferably talk rugby). Until action starts join in cheering etc.

We are co-ordinating action on a general scale - we cannot co-ordinate specifically (i.e. if you see a space, go over the fence, don't wait for a signal).

Action will be heralded by a small STST group soon after the start. If possible, make your attempt at this stage which will be the general signal to go on. If there is absolutely no question of your being able to get on at this stage do not show your hand, wait for an opportunity. Get over the fence by getting your front members to bend down and form a 'human ramp' with their backs. Once on, take one of two courses: if in small numbers, run about etc., so that others have time to join you; if in large numbers (over 20) sit-down and link arms back to back with your feet facing outwards. At all times refrain from provoking violence; if you are pulled free do not resist, but do not help either - get carried off.

GENERAL NOTES

- Keep "Disrupters" and "Chanters" separate.
- The match starts at 3 p.m. and all demonstrators, particularly "Disrupters", should be in the ground by 1-1.30 p.m., so that they can get down to the front.
- Wear respectable clothing; this is vital for anonymity.
- Uniformed and plain clothes policemen will be present in large numbers, as may "stewards".
- Coaches should park at least a mile away and demonstrators walk in inconspicuous groups to the ground.
- Read STST's legal briefing - this is important.
- Admission is through the turnstiles (at 5/-). Half-time: from 3.40 to 3.50; match ends at 4.30.

FINAL NOTE: Keep this briefing confidential to demonstrators. Do not be confused by the press build up which may be deliberately misleading. For further information please contact Peter Hair
