Flame Lily wines are marketed by AA Enterprises in association with Vincennes Wines and Spirits of Leeds, the sole importers. For every case of wine that you buy, AA Enterprises will make a donation to the Anti-Apartheid Movement for its campaigning work.

Flame Lily wines are supplied by the case of 12 x 75cl bottles and are now available in six different varieties. Delivery is charged at £6 per order of 1-5 cases, orders of 6 or more cases are delivered free - see details on order form.

SUPPORT THE FRONT LINE STATES

The Front Line (and neighbouring states of Southern Africa) are estimated to have suffered a staggering \$60 billion of damage from South African aggression and destabilisation in the last eight years alone. The total cost is attributable to Pretoria's policies since 1960 is over 1.3 million people, including hundreds of thousands of children.

These are the real costs of the refusal of the west, led by Britain, to impose economic sanctions against apartheid South Africa. Sanctions, properly enforced, would strip the South African army and airforce from attacking neighbouring countries and destroying their economies.

Today the Pretoria regime is pretending to be engaged in a 'peace' offensive in the region. In reality, South Africa is warning its forces, strengthening its nuclear capacity and clamping down on internal opposition through its national state of emergency.

The Front Line States of Angola, Botswana, Mozambique, Tanzania, Zambia and Zimbabwe face a formidable enemy. But despite the ever-present threat of apartheid warfare, they are continuing the struggle to build independent, non-racial democracies in the region and to win peace and prosperity for their peoples.
