outh Africa's **first ever** one-person, one-vote elections in April led to a victory by the African National Congress and to the election of Nelson Mandela as President.

South Africa Freedom Day is being organised to celebrate the establishment of South Africa's first ever democratic government. A multi-event day, it will build on the success of previous Freedom Runs which the AAM has organised in Brockwell Park every year since 1989, but this year there's much more on offer!

South Africa Freedom Day is a fun day out for everyone, with music, dance workshops, children's events, exhibitions, speakers, stalls and sponsored runs. As well as celebrating the outcome of the elections, South Africa Freedom Day marks the 35th anniversary of the Anti-Apartheid Movement, first launched as the Boycott Movement on the 26 June 1959 If you have ever been involved in the struggle against apartheid, you should definitely be at South Africa Freedom Day!

South Africa Freedom Day will be looking to the future. It will promote new forms of solidarity to overcome the legacies of apartheid and money raised will fund such solidarity. The day will also focus on the links between building a new non-racial South Africa and the fight against racism in Britain and Europe.

 - ◆ Listen to The Voice of the New South Africa, a short programme to include a prominent speaker from South Africa and Archbishop Trevor Huddleston. Witness the celebratory balloon race.
 - ◆ Take part in one of the sponsored runs. You can get fit and raise much needed funds to ensure that the new forms of solidarity become a reality.
