Mozambique— Cabora Bassa stop sanctions busting now

English Electric is negotiating with Portugal and South Africa for a share in the contract to build the Cabora Bassa dam.

Barclays Bank DCO is helping to finance it.

Cabora Bassa is a £175m project to create a supply of hydroelectricity for South Africa and Rhodesia.

Rhodesia will supply goods and raw materials to the construction firm.

Cabora Bassa will open up a cheap export waterway from Rhodesia to the sea.

Participation in this project will break sanctions.

The Cabora Bassa dam is part of the white Southern African line of defence against the advance of African liberation. Already South African troops are guarding the dam site. Southern Africa's security and Smith's survival depend on helping Portugal hold on to her African colonies.

But in Mozambique and Angola, the people are already in arms. The dam will not benefit the African people. 24,000 Africans will be removed to 'protected villages'. 1,000,000 white settlers will be imported to populate the rich, newly irrigated land.

Public opinion in Sweden, forced the Swedish firm ASEA to withdraw from their stake in the building of Cabora Bassa. Yet the Foreign Office and the Board of Trade have given encouragement to English Electric to take on the contract.

Now it's our turn to act.
