The mass Lobby of Parliament on June 17, 1986, is your chance to show your concern about Britain's policy towards South Africa and Namibia.

South Africa's disenfranchised majority are making daily sacrifices to end apartheid and gain independence. As resistance is met with greater violence, calls for more effective sanctions are clearly and urgently made by the oppressed.

There is widespread recognition that sanctions can contribute towards fundamental change in South Africa – a means of securing peaceful change and of reducing the prospect of escalating violence.

Britain is becoming increasingly isolated as one of the few nations continuing a policy of "constructive engagement": in 1985 within the EEC, Commonwealth and United Nations the UK blocked moves for meaningful-sanctions.

Here is a unique opportunity for you to focus the attention of your Member of Parliament on the situation in Southern Africa and to URGE MORE EFFECTIVE SANCTIONS AGAINST SOUTH AFRICA. They will help:

- halt South Africa's aggression against its own people and the countries of the region.

- end South Africa's illegal occupation of Namibia and secure the implementation of UN SCR 435
- secure the release of all South African and Namibian political prisoners and detainees.
