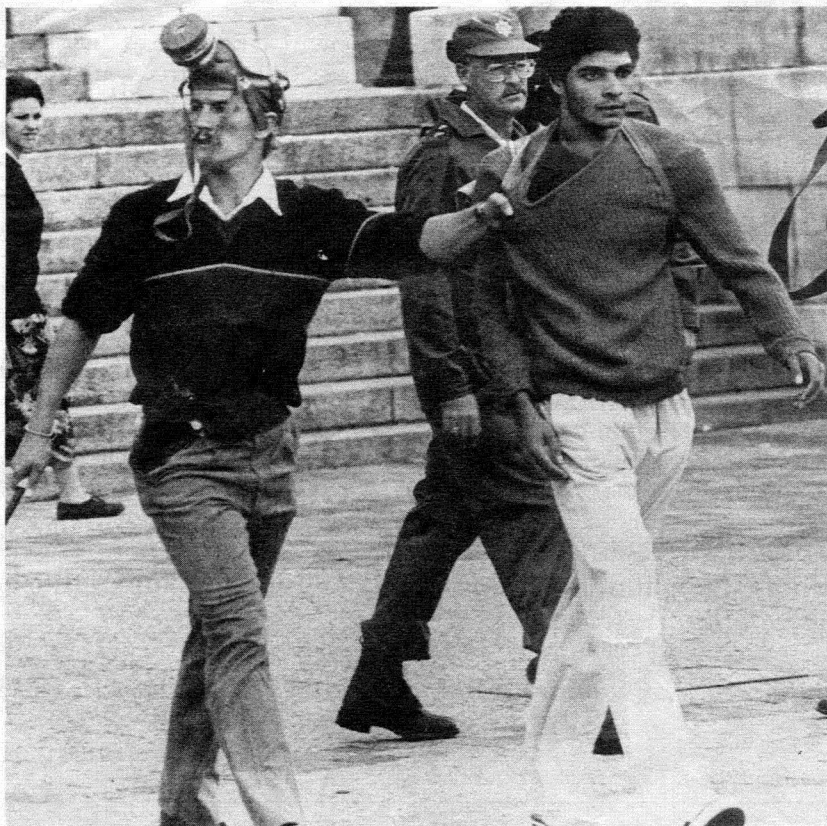

MONDAY 12 JUNE 1989 marks 3 years of South Africa's brutal State of Emergency. And 25 years since Nelson Mandela and other leaders of the anti-apartheid struggle were sentenced to life imprisonment. Most of them are still in jail.

State of emergency

- An average of around 30 people have been detained each day since the apartheid regime imposed a national State of Emergency on 12 June 1986.
- At least 8,000 children under the age of 18 were detained – many of them were tortured.
- Dozens of organisations have been banned from political activity, including the United Democratic Front, and the Congress of South African Trade Unions. Anti-apartheid publications have been banned, and the media censored.
- Hundreds of activists released from

detention because of their heroic mass Hunger Strikes are now subject to virtual house arrest.

For freedom in South Africa

- ▶ End the State of Emergency – allow free political activity
- ▶ Unconditional release of Nelson Mandela and all other political prisoners, detainees, and those banned and restricted
- ▶ Unban the ANC and all other banned organisations
- ▶ Dismantle apartheid and transfer power to the people in a democratic non-racial and unitary South Africa.

The apartheid regime is being forced to grant independence to Namibia. Now it must be compelled to give the same rights to the people of South Africa.
