

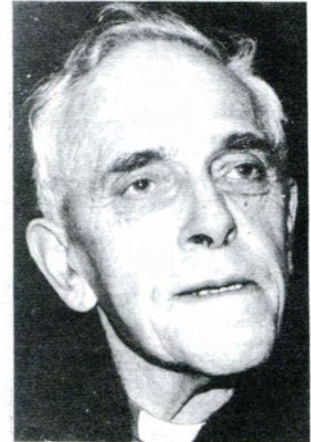


NELSON MANDELA FREEDOM MARCH

Between 12 June and 17 July some 25 brave souls will be making the long march from Glasgow to London – a distance of **600** miles.

Their purpose is one close to my heart: to carry the message of freedom for Nelson Mandela, for all South African and Namibian political prisoners, from Glasgow to London for a big rally on **July 17th** – the eve of **Nelson's 70th birthday**.



Nelson himself has spent 26 years in gaol. When I think of all the things I have done in that period, and how cruelly he has been cut off from life outside, I feel deep anger at the human waste. Yet he has triumphed over his gaolers, and today enjoys a repute even greater than the day when he was imprisoned.

I urge all who share the feeling of injustice that apartheid generates to sponsor generously the Anti-Apartheid Movement's walker **Alan Brooks**. Alan was detained tortured and then imprisoned for two years by the apartheid regime.

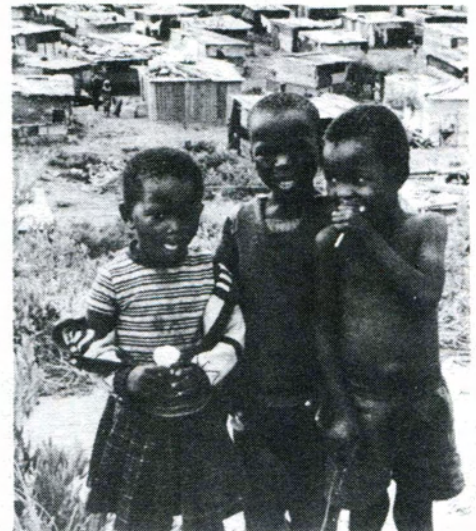
