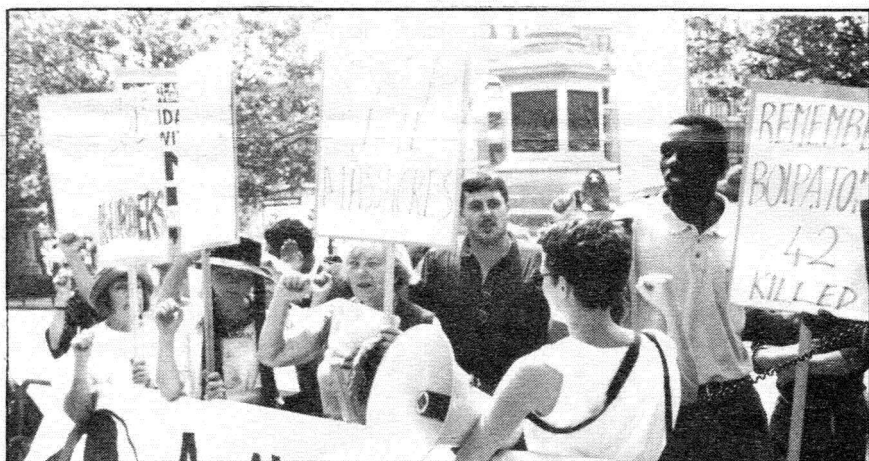

STOP THE VIOLENCE – DEMOCRACY IN SOUTH AFRICA NOW!

Two years ago on 13 September 1990, 26 commuters were murdered in cold blood on board a rush-hour train in Soweto. Over the past two years a total of 227 have been killed during 163 such attacks.

Since F.W. de Klerk came to power over 7,000 people have died in the political violence gripping the country. The South African police and security forces have fomented and instigated such violence, in order to try and prevent a genuine end to apartheid and the creation of a united, non-racial, non-sexist and democratic South Africa.

Between 12 and 13 September, Douglas Hurd will chair a meeting of EC Foreign Ministers at Broomfield Hall near Welwyn Garden City.

Make sure your voice is heard! March to Broomfield Hall in memory of the victims of the violence and demand that the European Community:

- Acts to stop the violence
- Supports democracy in South Africa, in particular, a constituent assembly, based on one-person, one-vote
- Reimposes sanctions against the apartheid regime
