When you boycott South African goods

you encourage the Africans who have called for this form of protest

you show your hatred for the racial oppression practised by Dr. Verwoerd's Government

you support the United Nations—which calls for a full boycott of South Africa.

When you buy South African

you strengthen apartheid

you help Dr. Verwoerd maintain his regime of race violence and repression against all opponents of apartheid

you help to perpetuate mass poverty and racial oppression in South Africa.

Over 40 countries are officially boycotting South Africa.

Look at the label!

Refuse South African goods all the time. Tell the shop assistants and the manager why. Ask them not to stock South African goods.

When you stop buying South African you help stop Britain's support for Apartheid

Anti-Apartheid Campaign

This year will see further expansion in our activities to secure:

On Political Prisoners

The implementation of the United Nations resolution for the release of all South African political prisoners and an investigation into their prison conditions.

On Arms

The achievement of a complete arms embargo, which will include ending:

- the supply of spare parts
- the export of machines and materials useful to the S. African arms industry
- the provision of both training facilities and military co-operation.

On Sanctions

British support for the United Nations in the imposition of collective international economic sanctions against South Africa.

On South West Africa

Freedom from apartheid rule.

On Culture and Sport

A boycott of all apartheid institutions by British artists and sportsmen.

The AAM will also urge Britain to take new initiatives through the United Nations to end apartheid.
