Our demonstrations against racist sport have already given tremendous inspiration and support to those non-white sportsmen who are seeking to break down racial barriers in South Africa — and to all the millions of oppressed people suffering under apartheid.

By receiving the Springbok cricket team we are guilty not just of condoning apartheid, but of perpetuating it. Not until they are excluded from international sport will white South African sportsmen demand the removal of politics from sport.

The Springbok team, chosen from a minority of South African cricketers on the basis of colour first and merit secondarily, is a living symbol of apartheid. Our march in May is an important stage in the build-up of a massive national campaign to sweep racist sport out of Britain forever.

Apartheid teams have been banned from world sport in boxing, soccer, fencing and several other games. Must cricket be the last resort of Nazi-type policies?
