BOYCOTT PRODUCTS OF APARTHEID!

Black victims of apartheid have called on the people of the world to isolate South Africa as the most effective way of helping their struggle for a free and non-racial future.

In South Africa, the African majority have no vote in the election of the Government. Every aspect of their lives is controlled by the fact that they are black.

The Government controls where they may live. 3 million people have already been moved from their homes, often for hundreds of miles, to satisfy apartheid's mad obsession with separating the races more and more completely. Already half the African workforce in the cities have been turned into migrant workers by this policy, compelled by law to leave behind in the "homelands" their wives and children and any other "superfluous appendages who could not provide service".

When black South Africans protest, as they do constantly and with enormous courage, they find the most peaceful marches, meetings and even funerals broken up with dogs, teargas and bullets.

Without collaboration from abroad, the apartheid regime could not sustain its appalling structures of oppression, its vast spending on troops and weapons to suppress its own population and make murderous attacks on neighbouring countries, or maintain the standard of living for white South Africans which makes it all worth their while. This collaboration includes oil supplies (especially from Shell and BP), foreign investment (60% is British), foreign technology, electronic and military equipment, foreign tourism and bank loans, and the sale of apartheid produce. The Anti-Apartheid Movement works to oppose all these forms of collaboration.

As a shopper, you have a vital role in the campaign to cut off the flow of funds that sustain apartheid. You can refuse as an individual to buy any goods from South Africa or from Namibia (which South Africa illegally occupies). You can also urge the shops you use to stop selling apartheid products.

WILLIAM LOW

The Anti-Apartheid Movement in Scotland is calling on William Low, as the leading grocery chain controlled from Scotland, to halt the sale of apartheid products in all its stores, including Laves which it now owns. In a polite reply to a letter from the AAM, the company declined to halt such sales.

We therefore ask all shoppers to join us in pressing William Low to change its policy, and join the international boycott of South Africa.

- Sign the AAM petition to William Low.
- Speak or write to the manager of any local shop that sells South African products, including branches of William Low.
- Check the label on every purchase you make. You might be surprised where apartheid products crop up.
- Join the Anti-Apartheid Movement, and help us to isolate South Africa in every way.
