All goods sold in the UK must state their country of origin. Look at the label carefully. If it says *Republic of South Africa* or *Namibia* don't buy it. Be particularly careful with tinned goods (apples, peaches, pears, guavas, pineapples, plums, oranges, mandarins etc) and <u>fresh fruit</u> – especially OUTSPAN and VALENCIA oranges and all CAPE fruit.

Complain to the Manager

and tell him or her that you strongly object to the South African goods displayed on their shelves. Don't stop there – write to TESCO's Board of Directors, to your MP, sign our petitions, join our picket and the Anti-Apartheid Movement. Don't stop your protests until you are certain that all South African goods have been withdrawn from sale.

We are winning

Already public pressure has forced management to withdraw South African goods from Tesco stores in Brixton, Bristol and elsewhere. Why not your supermarket? Many small stores are already "Apartheid-Free". Look for our distinctive Black and Yellow Sticker.
