- *Britain is South Africa's third most important trading partner
 - * 50% of foreign investment in South Africa is British.
 - * Of the eleven states of Southern Africa eight are english speak ing and used to be part of the British Empire.
 - * The South African army is one of the best equipped in the world (including a nuclear capability) due in part to British collaboration.
 - * Many major British firms are household names in South Africa
 - * Many white South Africans are our kith and kin.
 - * Apartheid's cheap labour system produces cheap imports which undermine British firms and British jobs.

SOUTHERN AFRICA RESOURCE CENTRE

The Southern Africa Resource Centre was established in 1989 to advance the education of the public in the south West of England as to the theory and practise of Apartheid in the fields of Southern African art, culture, history and current affairs. It aims to achieve this by:

- * Opening a Resource Centre in Bristol to cover the South West. The centre will be open to the public and will contain literature, videos, exhibitions, poetry, art, music etc about and from South Africa and the Front Line States. Much of this material will be for hire or loan throughout the South West.
- *Running an Education Project which will involve a full time teacher who will prepare educational materials about Apartheid suitable for use in schools. Where appropiate they will go into schools and colleges to assist teaching staff in running courses on Southern Africa. This service will also be available to other specialist groups eg youth clubs, womens groups, churches, trade unions etc. This project will also encourage educational links with the Front Line States such as school to school and college to college. Such contacts will be valuable in raising awareness about Southern Africa.
