Completed petition forms should be returned by 1st December 1987, together with any donations received. Any such donations will go towards defraying the costs of the petition campaign. Any surplus will be used to provide relief for detainees and their families.

On 10th December, United Nations Human Rights Day, the results of the Petition Campaign will be presented to the United Nations Secretary General, the British Prime Minister, and the South African authorities.
