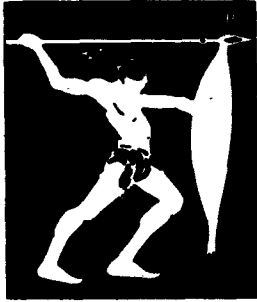

# AFRICAN NATIONAL (South CONGRESS Africa)



# 1912 1982

At the turn of the century in what was then a British colony – the Union of South Africa – the foundations of today's Apartheid society were being laid. The South African liberation movement, the African National Congress (South Africa), was founded in 1912 to unify African resistance against British/Boer colonial domination.

Fifty years of mainly non-violent resistance followed but was met with increasing repression which culminated in 1959 with the Sharpeville massacre. This was followed in 1960 by the banning of the ANC (SA) and the movement embarked on an armed struggle against the Apartheid regime.

Today over 50% of foreign investment in South Africa is British and British companies and banks support the Apartheid regime with technology and finance. Meanwhile, the African National Congress (SA) has the support of the United Nations and the Organisation of African Unity. Recent developments inside the country show the growing resistance of the people and support for the ANC(SA) and its imprisoned leaders like Nelson Mandela.

To celebrate the 70 years of struggle Merseyside Anti-Apartheid Group, together with Another View Film Society and Liberty Hall, has organised a weekend of events on January 15-17 at Stanley House and the Catholic Chaplaincy.
