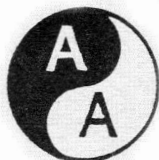

MARCH: MONTH OF ACTION FOR PEOPLE'S SANCTIONS!

IN SOUTH AFRICA the level of resistance to Apartheid is higher than ever before. The government has responded with a new level of repression: censorship of the media, police and army curfews, mass arrests and mistreatment - it is estimated that 87% of detainees are physically tortured.

IN BRITAIN we have a choice: do we continue to have truck with the Apartheid regime or do we wish to take sides with those resisting Apartheid?

The people of South Africa have made their feelings clear: church groups, community organisations and trades unions have all appealed to Britain to break all links with South Africa, to isolate Apartheid. In the words of Bishop Desmond Tutu: "if we don't have sanctions soon, then heaven help us. If sanctions are not applied soon then the future will be catastrophic."

As Bishop Tutu says, we cannot delay our response any longer. March 21st this year marks the 27th Anniversary of the Sharpeville massacre, when 69 people were gunned down in a peaceful protest against Apartheid. Now, every day that goes by, more people are killed and the situation slips nearer to catastrophe. That is why March is a special Anti-Apartheid month of action with a programme of events designed to express our opposition in some way; these individual acts all add up to something powerful!

1. Don't buy South African goods.
2. Write to your councillor or MP during the month of action calling for national and local sanctions against Apartheid.
3. Join in our programme of events.
4. Join the local Anti-Apartheid Group.
